Station Place: A New Chapter of Care and Community in Havelock

On September 15, 2025, we officially opened the doors of Station Place Long-Term Care Home to our first residents — marking not just the completion of a building, but the realization of a promise to Havelock and surrounding communities. With 128 modern, comfortable beds and a design centered on dignity and belonging, Station Place represents the best of what long-term care can be: a home where people live, not just reside.

From the earliest planning meetings to the first day of admissions, this project has been a labour of collaboration and care. AON Inc., our parent company, worked tirelessly alongside architects, construction teams, and the Ministry of Long-Term Care to bring this vision to life. The result is a high-tech, beautifully designed home that blends comfort with safety — from spacious resident rooms to advanced nurse-call systems and welcoming community spaces that invite families to stay, visit, and connect.

In the weeks leading up to opening, the excitement inside the home was palpable. Staff from AON's other long-term care homes, along with team members from AON's Construction and Building Divisions, came together to help prepare Station Place for its debut. They unpacked equipment, trained new staff, and ensured every detail was ready — right down to the smallest touches that make a home feel like home.
